7.4.4 Thaksin University's Solar Rooftop System Generates Clean Electricity Toward
Becoming a Green University Across Both Campuses



Thaksin University, as one of Thailand's leading higher education institutions, has made a clear commitment to driving Thai society toward carbon neutrality, in alignment with national goals and global sustainable development imperatives. The University has actively joined the "ECOLIFE in U" initiative and was selected as one of the top three universities with the most **outstanding performance in the ECOLIFE in U Program for 2024.**

TSU emphasizes the importance of reducing waste and achieving carbon neutrality. Through the "ECOLIFE in U" project—supported by the Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research and Innovation (MHESI) in collaboration with KidKid Co., Ltd.—the University promotes behavioral change among staff and students through concrete, measurable environmental actions.



With systematic and participatory implementation, Thaksin University has been selected as one of the top three higher education institutions with the most outstanding performance in Thailand under the ECOLIFE in U Project 2024. Throughout the project period, from August 2024 to May 2025, TSU achieved exceptional results on the “ECOLIFE” platform, ranking among the top three universities with the highest recorded reductions in waste weight and carbon footprint in the ECOLIFE in U system.

Thaksin University will receive this prestigious award on 28 August 2025, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., at the Press Conference Room, 1st Floor, King Mongkut Building, Office of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research and Innovation (Yothi Road).
