Thaksin University Joins Forces with the Songkhla Lake Basin Network to Advance the Development of a Learning City



The Workshop for the Network of Agencies Driving the Development of a Learning City, under the research program “Songkhla Lake: A Three-Water Ecosystem for Learning and Development through Creative and Sustainable Economic City Mechanisms,” is conducted within the overarching research framework of “Enhancing and Advancing Learning Cities.”

This initiative aims to promote the development of Learning Cities in Thailand through collaborative research under the project “Songkhla Lake: A Three-Water Ecosystem for Learning and Development through Creative and Sustainable Economic City Mechanisms.”



The workshop is organized through the collaboration of Thaksin University, the Teachers’ Council of Thailand (Khurusapha), and representatives of key government agencies from both Songkhla Province and Phatthalung Province.

This project is organized to foster a clear understanding of the research program’s implementation and to jointly define approaches for developing a Learning City within the Songkhla Lake Basin. The initiative employs innovation and technology to enhance **high-quality learning in a multicultural context, improve quality of life**, and promote sustainable development through mechanisms of a creative economy city.

The target groups include youth living around the Songkhla Lake Basin, local fishing communities, coastal community enterprises, women's groups, community leaders, local wisdom bearers, tourists and tourism service providers.
